Personnel will meet with Will, Christina, Steve and Pastor Peter on August 13. We will meet with Charlotte on August 14 and discuss their self-evaluation. **Finance** has accepted a bid from Kevin Stover, General Contractor, to replace the concrete at the west entrance for \$5,865.00. <u>Finance needs</u> your committee budget proposals by September 8.

Nurture reported they will be celebrating teachers on September 10. They continue to discuss who will take care of weekly flower arrangements for the sanctuary. The Hymn Sing was well received July 23 (with salad lunch pitch-in afterward). Children's Sunday School will resume July 30. **Mission and Outreach** announces that there will be an open house on August 5 at the new location of the Baptist Church. Our church will be open on September 23 for the Greenwood Fall Homes Tour. Blessing of the Animals will be October 7.

Old Business There will be a Congregations Meeting on <u>August 13</u> for a first reading of a change to our bylaws about the number of Session and Deacon members. We are considering reducing the size of the Boards from 9 to 6 because of the reduced size of our congregation and the difficulty of

finding people to serve. The final reading will be on October 15 at our Fall Congregational Meeting, along with electing elders and deacons for 2026. Pastor Peter will be on vacation from August 31 to September 5.

OUR LAST RUMMAGE/BAKE SALE

Our Rummage/Bake Sale is scheduled for **Friday**, **August 18th from 8am-4pm and Saturday**, **August 19th from 8am-1pm**. The ¹/₂ price feature will be in effect on Saturday from 11am-1pm.

There are many jobs that must be done for the sale to be profitable. Tables have to be rearranged in rooms 16-18-20 on July 23rd or 24th. Tables in Fellowship Hall can't be rearranged until August 15th.

Donations can be brought to room 16-18-20 beginning <u>July 26th until August 12th</u>, and placed on the table tops for sorting. The church and these rooms will be open from 9:00am to 1:00pm each day. Sorting will continue each day until <u>August 15th</u> when the crates filled with items to be displayed in Fellowship Hall will be carted there for pricing. Pricing will be done <u>August 15th</u>, 16th and 17th.

Baked goods can be brought to Fellowship Hall on Thursday, <u>August 17th</u> between 4pm and 7pm. Dividing and repackaging, as well as pricing, must be done that evening to be ready for the sale the next day.

Tables also must be brought to the downstairs hallway <u>August 16th-17th</u> to be ready for cashiers and baggers.

On the day of the sale, a few workers are needed in Rooms 16-18-20 and Fellowship Hall to assist shoppers and to keep things looking neat. When the sale is over, we must have people to pack up the leftovers. Some of our Boy Scouts and their leaders will load their trucks for transport to the Salvation Army store on State Road 135.

As you can see, it takes both men and women to get everything in place for our LAST sale. Come as often as you can and help in as many ways as you can. The proceeds from our sale will benefit many mission projects. Thanks to all of you who helped make this possible!

Recipe of the Month

BANANA BARS

Ingredients

- ✤ 1 ½ cups sugar
- ✤ 1 cups sour cream
- ✤ ¹/₂ cup unsalted butter (1 stick)
- 2 eggs
- ✤ 3 or 4 ripe bananas (1 ¾ cups)
- 2 tsp vanilla
- 2 cups flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- ✤ ¾ teaspoon salt
- ¹/₂ cup chopped walnuts

Frosting

- ✤ ¹/₂ cup unsalted butter
- ✤ 3 ¾ cups powdered sugar
- ✤ 1 teaspoon vanilla
- ✤ 3 teaspoons milk



Heat oven to 375 degrees and grease a 10x15 pan. In a large bowl beat sour cream, butter, eggs and vanilla. Blend in mashed bananas with mixer. Add sugar and other dry ingredients. Mix for 1 minute. Stir in nuts and pour batter into pan. Bake 25-35 minutes. Check at 20 minutes until golden brown. Cool slightly until warm. Frost with browned butter frosting.

Frosting:

Heat butter in saucepan past melting point until its boiling and delicate brown. Remove from heat and immediately add remaining ingredients to the frosting. This should be thicker than glaze and thinner than frosting. Watch continually.

You will probably need to add more milk to get correct consistency. Sprinkle some larger pieces of walnuts on top of frosting, using a spatula to spread over the top of bars immediately. The frosting will be easier to spread once it is on the cake.
